**Testing Years 2012-2013, 2013-14, and 2014-15**  
 (State defined by location of test center)

Disclaimer about Data Sorted by Test Center: Although many examinees test in the same state in which they attend undergraduate school, this is not the case for all examinees. Some examinees test in another state for one of several reasons, including: a) they are out of school and reside in a different state from that in which they received their undergraduate education, b) they are testing during a vacation period when they are not at their undergraduate location. Even more importantly, the GRE® revised General test has not been designed to measure state level education outcomes. For all of these reasons, caution should be exercised in seeing these results as an accurate reflection on the current undergraduate curriculum.
